Jane and Micheal walked with their father to the bank as an outing because Mr. Banks thought the bank would be a good way to teach his children about life. The suggestion was placed in his head by Mary Poppins, the children's nanny. Michael observed the woman and wanted to spend his coins on bird seed. But his father thought it would be better to invest his money in the bank and receive interest payments in the future. There is a dilemma, what do we teach our children? Clearly, we must plan toward the future to save some amount of money because there are times when we experience unexpected expenses. The house needs a roof, a quiet furnace, or a new washer and dryer. Life can deal us many obstacles we have to work through. Michael, in his innocence, is not looking toward the future. He is witnessing a smaller vision of hungry birds needing to be fed. Jesus tells his disciple about the man whose barn was so full that he could not store any more grain in it. #### AD BOARD MEETING

The Ad Board meeting was held on Thursday, April 18th at 6pm in the parlor. Attending the meeting were Gail Proctor, Sandy Wittmeyer, Nancy Schwab, Pastor Jeff, Doug Miller, Mark Vona, and Mike Campbell. Pastor Jeff opened the meeting with a prayer and noted that Ken Prawel was having heart tests at Gates and that Roberta Gard from the Colden church is not doing well.

Committee Reports - Mike gave an update on the Child Center, Nancy on the Worship Committee & United Women in Faith, and Doug on the Trustees. Doug reported that he and Shane have been meeting with boiler suppliers to finalize plans to replace the Child Center and Narthex boiler. The plan is to install a set of boilers like the ones installed last year on the south end of the building along with other required air and water handling equipment. There was no finance report this month. Jeff noted under Lay Leader that the Annual Conference would be May 30-June 1st. Jeff and one church member usually go. The meetings typically include reports by the various committees. Mark reported that we will host the second annual "Hymn Fest" on Saturday, June 1st. The plan is to showcase the myriad of diverse hymns throughout our land. The first Hymn Fest was a great success so we very much look forward to another music-filled, inspiring day.

Jeff recently announced that he would be retiring at the end of 2024. In Jeff's pastor report we discussed the process and items to consider as we select our next pastor. He said that the District will consider candidates this summer and would then offer a suggested candidate. The candidate and the church would meet, with each side required to agree with the selection. The church committee that will lead the selection process is the Pastor Parish Relations (PPR) committee. Anyone interested in participating in the process should contact Jeff. Jeff reviewed his current compensation compared to District recommendations. There is a possibility that costs for an incoming pastor will be higher. Considering the number of people attending church at Churchill and Colden, there is a possibility that we will get a part-time pastor. This would decrease the pastor cost, but also decrease the pastor coverage.





Jeff noted that we need to present our needs/expectations for the incoming pastor. Some questions we need to consider in this process are: How do we identify the church? What do we want from our pastor? What is Outreach to us? Jeff has recently updated our Church Profile which answers some of these questions. Some churches have profiles, some do not. This information is referenced by prospective pastors to better understand the church they are considering joining. It was agreed by the board that the various committee chairpersons would solicit feedback from church members on these questions with the intent to further update our profile. This is an opportune time for the church to reflect on what we want to be going forward..... goals, mission, etc. Please don't hesitate to contact any board member/committee chair with any questions or input.

The meeting was closed with a prayer by Pastor Jeff.

Operations at the CCC continue to go well. There are currently 55 children from 46 families attending. The staff has been running a candy sale to raise money to buy more toys for the kids. We are lucky to have such a loving, caring staff! The CCC is also running a flower sale with baskets and various vegetables and annual flowers available.

The Center is donating \$15,000 to the boiler fund in lieu of having a 15% rent increase over the next three and a half years. The Finance Committee/Trustees were considering a 15% rent increase, but opted to get the one-time donation instead. It will be a big help toward our \$50,000 boiler fund goal.
